Abstract Submission Deadline: **September 30, 2018**

The Transient Recorder Users Council and Georgia Tech is pleased to issue a Call for Papers for the 2019 Fault and Disturbance Analysis Conference. Papers should be of a non-commercial, technical nature on topics related to transient recorders, fault and disturbance analysis in electrical power transmission, generation and distribution systems.

Papers in the following topics are of interest:

- Developments in Hardware and Software Technology for Transient Recording
- Novel Applications of Transient Recordings
- PMU Applications
- Experiences with Web-based Technology for IED Transient Recordings
- Analysis of Disturbance Events of a Unique, Unusual, or Educational Nature
- Changes to Application Criteria as a Result of the Industry Restructuring
- Reliability and Predictive Maintenance
- Power Quality

Prospective authors should follow these submission guidelines:

Abstracts: Recommended length is about half a page and should not exceed one page. To submit an abstract, authors should register on the conference web site (http://www.ap-concepts.com/2019_FDA/openconf.php). If submitting multiple abstracts, authors should register separately for each abstract. For each submission, the following information will be required:

- For each author: name, organization, country, and e-mail
- Contact Author email and telephone number
- Keywords
- Abstract text (typed or pasted into provided box)
- Password (of your choice)

Once the submission entry is completed, you will be provided with a submission number. Please save the **submission number** and **password** since this information will be needed later in order to upload your paper, bio, and presentation material, once the paper has been accepted.

Deadline: Abstracts should be submitted to the conference web site by **September 30, 2018**. You will receive confirmation of your submission immediately. The submission site will open on **May 7, 2018** and close on **September 30** at midnight.

Paper Selection: Selections will be announced end-December. To be included in the conference proceedings, selected papers must be submitted in MS Word or PDF format three weeks prior to the conference. Electronic copy is strongly recommended.
